BUILDING UPDATES

We have added new, vinyl flooring in all the hallways. We also updated the front door with graphic vinyl coverings which are attractive but also provide safety because you can see out from inside the building but now outsiders cannot see in. FMES/FMMS flags were added to the parking lot. There was a concession stand added to the baseball area, and it should be completed soon. Over the summer, the gym is being repainted, the floors in the gyms are being re-painted and then restrained, and the doorways leading into classrooms will be repainted (they get hit with shoulders, binders, and bags day in and day out, so they are scratched up).
