WHAT MAKES US SPECIAL

Our students, staff, and families work hard to achieve success in all the areas exemplified by the profile of the SC Graduate: world-class knowledge, world-class skills, and life and career characteristics. Here are just a few of our Bulldog Brags!

- We celebrate our outstanding teachers each month with a special Teacher of the Month recognition selected by the students.
- Our school community raised over \$18,000 for Special Olympics, placing us 1st in the District Contest for Polar Plunge.
- We recognized over 75 students this year for outstanding behavior in our Student of the Quarter program.
- We have several former Bulldogs that return to our hallways as Teacher Cadets from the local high school to learn what it's like to be a teacher and mentor our students.
- The Bulldog Shake competition was back this year! 27 students competed using their soft skills and were judged by community members from a variety of fields.
- Each week our 7th grade teachers recognize Students of the Week and award them a prize (thanks to donations from our parent community)
- 7th grade students learned about the impact of the Holocaust from a current student's surviving family member.
- Our general settings music class put on multiple performances showcasing the talents of our special settings students working along with our general education students.



- The Bulldog Robotics team competed in the Slapshot Challenge as well as won competitions at the regional, state, and world level.
- Mr. Hammond started up a new club, Chess Mate's with over 45 student members.
- Our band program thrives with 39 students in All-Region Band, 8 students in All-State Band, 1 student in All-State Orchestra, and 2 students marching with FMHS Band. The band received Superior with Distinction ratings at the SCBDA Concert Performance Assessment. Our jazz band, percussion ensemble, and pep band display their talents at a variety of school events.
- Our art club has developed and installed a continuous hallway mural down our related arts hallway. Other artists received awards at our District Art Show.
- 8th Grade Honors Chorus received an Excellent rating at the SCMEA Choral Performance Assessment.
- 7th Grade Honors Chorus received a Superior rating at the SCMEA Choral Performance Assessment.
- Our students competed at the Winthrop Feria Spanish Competition and received notable, excellent, and outstanding ratings.
- The Matilda Jr. cast performed for Broadway professionals at the Junior Theater Celebration in Charlotte.

PTO SUPPORT

Our Parent Teacher Organization works tirelessly to provide support for our academic programs as well as provide encouragement for our staff. They provided over \$28,000 in enriching curriculum programs and resources. Our teachers also enjoy spontaneous luncheons and snack carts to keep them energized throughout the school year.



ATHLETIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The GHMS Dance team received several podium placements in local competitions as well as a the special judges award for future varsity dancers.
- Girls on the Run Heart & Sole had their biggest team yet and ended the season at the 5k Reindeer Romp in Rock Hill.
- 7th Grade Boys Basketball went to the Championships.
- Boys and Girls track teams placed 3rd in the Conference.
- Girls soccer finished the regular season as the #1 seed and won the Conference Championship.
