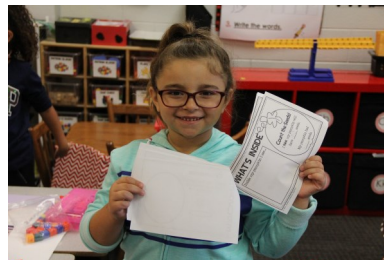
Purpose of the Report

School Goal Areas

- Teaching and Learning:** Our goal is to increase student achievement by analyzing student test data from SC Ready, SC PASS, MAP, STAR, and F&P assessments to target areas of growth for intervention and enrichment purposes. Teachers have collaborated using Professional Learning Communities (PLC) in the area of math to assist in our student achievement goals. Teachers participated in Student Learning Objectives (SLO) by setting growth goals for students in reading using assessment data. Monthly professional development was provided for staff in the areas of Literacy, Math, and STEAM to enhance instruction.
- Continuous Improvement:** Our grade level teams created and utilized common assessments in math. This provided our staff more opportunities to analyze data and target areas where students need further instruction and enrichment. Our school and district partnered with Discovery Education to form Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Math (STEAM) Teacher Leaders. This group of teacher leaders will participate in a five year professional development series with Discovery Education.
- Leadership and Communication:** SES provided opportunities for families to be active participants in their child's academic growth by offering events such as: Meet the Teacher, Literacy Night, STEAM Night, various Writing Celebrations, & other opportunities to attend events supporting our students. We also strived to improve communication by creating a school Twitter account.
- Resources, Safety, and Student Support:** SES, along with FMSD, developed a multi-tiered student support system (MTSS) to help identify students who need further interventions. We strive to continue to maintain a 95% satisfaction rating on our social and physical environment from students, parents, and teachers.

Service Learning & Community Partnerships
