#### School Goal Areas

- Teaching and Learning: Our goal is to increase student achievement by analyzing student test data from SC Ready, SC PASS, MAP, STAR, and F&P to target areas for intervention and enrichment purposes. Teachers collaborate using Professional Learning Communities (PLC) in the area of math and writing to assist in our student achievement goals. Teachers participated in Student Learning Objectives (SLO) by setting growth goals for students in reading. Monthly professional development was provided for staff in the areas of Literacy, Math, and STEAM to enhance instruction.
- Continuous Improvement: Our grade level teams created and
