GOALS FOR SPRINGFIELD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Teaching and Learning: Our goal is to continue to show growth and increase student achievement on SC Ready, SC PASS, STAR, and F&P assessments. Teachers collaborate weekly using PLC's in math and ELA to help achieve these goals. The teachers also set professional growth goals within their SLO's, which they self-reflect and collaborate with others to grow as an educator.

Continuous Improvement: Monthly professional development is provided in the areas of math, literacy, and STEAM. We also continued our partnership with Discovery Education to enhance our instruction. We also started Teachers as Leaders, where teachers provide professional development to each other based on their strengths.

Leadership and Communication: SFES provided opportunities for families to be active participants in their child's academic growth virtually, by offering events such as: Meet the Teacher, Rodeo Night, various Writing Celebrations, & other opportunities. We strive to have effective communication with parents by utilizing weekly Tuesday folders, Web Page, Hoofbeat Weekly Newsletter for parents, Weekly Colt Courier news for staff, #SESHoovesUp Twitter Account, and School & PTA Facebook Pages.

Resources, Safety, and Student Support: We continue to support students through our MTSS process to identify students who need intervention. We have a full-time security guard and use flexible groups for intervention. We strive to be above 95% for satisfaction of physical and social environments. Our school safety team meets twice yearly to determine our needs as a school.

Winthrop University: SFES continued into year Five of its partnership with Winthrop University. We hosted several aspiring teachers during their internships from Winthrop as well as other universities.

University of Kansas Partnership: Collaboration to implement, analyze effectiveness, and make improvements to our school wide Ci3T supports for our students and staff.

Host Teacher Cadets: Continued partnership with Nation Ford High School to support the teacher cadet program.

Springfield Clubs: SFES has continued to improve student opportunities through clubs by providing opportunities to participate in Gardening, Chorus, Jump Rope, Girls on the Run, Let Me Run, Yearbook, Safety Patrol, Recycling, and Flag clubs.

Area Beautification: Our School partnered with a local rowing club, BETA clubs, and other community members to assist with beautifying our school grounds.

Fundraising: SFES has continued our partnership with Boosterthon to assist us with fundraising to help support our students. We had funds for our classroom libraries, make our playgrounds more enjoyable, and beautify school.
