# Service Learning & Community Partnerships

Environmental Club: These students and teacher leaders learn about and promote awareness of environmental issues in the community, operate the school's recycling program, and participate in many community activities such as A.S.C. Greenway Earth Day Festival and the A.S.C. Greenway Student Art Competition

Fort Mill Care Center: The Student Council sponsored a can food drive to benefit the center in the Fall. Approximately 1,000 pounds of food was collected.
