## **Strategic Plan**

### **Goal # I** Student Achievement

- \* "Eggspress," a computer-based comprehension program will be implemented as a RTI (Response to Intervention) through Tier I and Tier II interventions. Continue "Stop, Grab It, and Read!"
- \* ELA/Math teachers will create and implement small group instruction daily within their classes. Writing across the curriculum and daily reading logs will be implemented.
- \* Provide a career-focused curriculum through Job Shadowing, Career Fair, and Career Development classes. Select students will participate in leadership opportunities.
- \* Homework assignments will be given 4 times weekly.
- \* Make instruction more interesting and up-to-date to match 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning by educating our students based on proper etiquette regarding the use of technology.
- \* Continue to expose our students to college field trips, 1 per grade level.
- \* Teachers will continue student remediation in content areas during activity time, after school, and through the use of "Study Island," a computer-based instructional program.

## **Goal # II** Teacher Quality

- \* Vertical Articulation meeting opportunities within the content teams and/or grade levels will be provided. Cross grade curricular meetings between the core subjects departments will continue to be implemented.
- \* Improve classroom instruction. Teachers will share Best Practices during faculty/staff monthly meetings to include: classroom management, creating computer writing assessments, technology, explicit instruction, updated Common Core Standards training, and bullying strategies.
- \* Provide time for curriculum and assessment development for faculty one Wednesday per month. A Data Wall will be established to display information obtained from achievement tests to assist each teacher in driving his/her instruction utilizing Balanced Literacy.
- \* More training in technology and Common Core Standards will be provided.
- \* Teachers will be trained and begin to implement "USATestprep," benchmark-type Assessments. Time for curriculum and assessment development opportunities will be provided as Professional Development on a monthly bases.

### **Goal # III** School Climate

- \* Continue to develop consistent teacher/parent communication through PowerSchool, Parent Portal, e-mails, phone calls, teacher websites, call alert, and school newsletters.
- \* "Overcoming Obstacles," a life skills program will be implemented. Teachers will continue to serve as mentors to select students.
- \* Host quarterly Parent Workshops and Family Education Nights.
- \* Continue with and create job shadowing opportunities with local professional.
- \* Continue bully and victim interventions (Zero Tolerance).
- \* Enforce the school and district dress code.
- \* Coaches will continue to monitor athletes for achievement and behavior.
