- Two students went to the South Carolina Regional Science Fair and won placements. Seventh grader, Maurice McClary won 1st prize and sixth grader, Amber Carr won third place.
- We have implemented Junior
 Achievement at Felton through the services of one of our parents, Phebian Davis-Culler. Junior Achievement works with local businesses and
