

## Student Achievement Data – 2018

- The 2018 Senior Class earned \$3,170,068 in scholarship offerings.
- Four students were named South Carolina Palmetto Fellows for a total of \$116,800 to attend college in South Carolina. Eligibility requirements include at least a 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT, a 3.5 cumulative GPA, and a top six percent ranking.
- Thirty-eight students were recipients of the South Carolina Four-Year Life Scholarship for a total of \$760,000.
- Thirty-seven students were recipients of the South Carolina Two-Year Life Scholarship for a total of \$370,000.
- Fifty-nine students were recipients of the South Carolina Lottery Tuition Assistance Scholarship for a total of \$134,520.
- Four boys and two girls attended Palmetto Boys' and Girls' State respectively.
- Thirty-seven students were Honor Graduates.
- The 2018 On-Time Graduation Rate was 83.4%, while the state average was 81.0%.
- The 2018 Advanced Placement Human Geography Success Rate was 61.5%.
- The 2018 Average SAT Composite score was 1018 (Verbal was 518 & Math was 500).

Students are able to participate in numerous extracurricular activities, including Technology Student Association, Student Council, Beta Club, Prom Committee, National Honor Society, Athletics, Band, Yearbook, BHS Singers, Debate, and Work-Based Learning.

## School Achievements – 2018 | 2019

- Carol Dean was selected as the 2018-2019 Teacher of the Year.
- Twenty-seven students were inducted into the Warhorse Chapter of the National Honor Society.
- Eighteen students competed in the Technology Student Association State Competition. A team of two students earned a first-place finish in the Technology & Problem Solving event which earned them the opportunity to compete in nationals.
- Three Scarlet Knights, including one middle school student, were selected for region band, and two Scarlet Knights were selected for All State.
- The Varsity Game Day Cheerleading Squad won the A-AA-AAA Game Day Cheerleading State Championship.
- The Varsity Football team won the AA Lower State Championship.
- Several athletic teams won region championships, including boys' tennis, girls' soccer, baseball, football, boys' cross country, and boys track & field.
- Four students received athletic scholarships.
- Several students were selected to participate in all-star athletic events, including three cheerleaders and six football players in the Border Bowl and one football player in the North-South Football Game.
- One faculty member was selected as the head coach of the North-South Soccer Game, and another faculty member was selected as the head coach of both the North-South and Border Bowl Football Games.

### Student Achievement

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the on-time graduation rate for students will be 82% or will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the percentage of students who score 70 or above on the End-of-Course Examination Program assessments will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the mean composite SAT score will meet or exceed the national average.

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the mean composite ACT score will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the percentage of students who score 3 or above on AP Exams will meet or exceed the average of schools with students comparable to ours.

### Teacher/Administrator Quality

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the number of core academic subject area teachers who maintain certified status will be 99%.

### School Climate

By the end of the 2018-2019 academic year, the percentage of students, parents, and teachers satisfied with the learning environment, physical environment, and home-school relations will be at least 82%.
