

Student Achievement Data – 2017

- The 2017 Senior Class earned \$3,647,413 in scholarship offerings.
- Nine students were named South Carolina Palmetto Fellows for a total of \$262,800 to attend college in South Carolina. Eligibility requirements include at least a 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT, a 3.5 cumulative GPA, and a top six percent ranking.
- Twenty-six students were recipients of the South Carolina Four-Year Life Scholarship for a total of \$520,000.
- Twenty-five students were recipients of the South Carolina Two-Year Life Scholarship for a total of \$250,000.
- Fifty-eight students were recipients of the South Carolina Lottery Tuition Assistance Scholarship for a total of \$132,240.
- Three boys and two girls attended Palmetto Boys' and Girls' State respectively.
- Twenty-four students were Honor Graduates.
- The 2017 On-Time Graduation Rate increased 3.5 points to 83.7%. The state average was 84.6%.
- The 2017 Advanced Placement Calculus Success Rate increased 16.7 points to 100%.
- The 2017 Average SAT Composite score increased 30 points to 1029 – Verbal increased 32 points to 523 and Math decreased 2 points to 506.

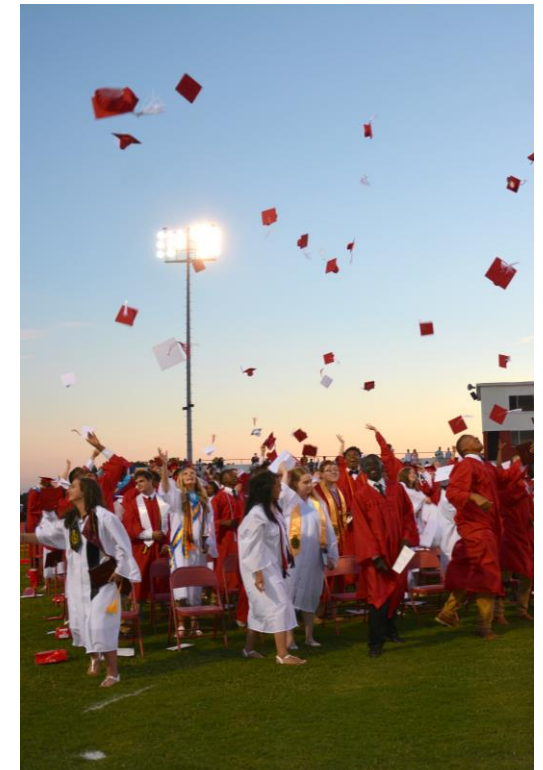

- Jared Thrasher was selected as the 2017-2018 Teacher of the Year.
- Twenty-three students were inducted into the Warhorse Chapter of the National Honor Society.
- Several students received Spanish awards, including a first-place finish in the South Carolina Spanish Digital Poster Contest; a second- and third-place finish in the singing competition at Augusta University; and a first-place finish in spelling and a third-place finish in cultural trivia at the Spanish Contest Festival of South Carolina.
- Fifteen students competed in the Technology Student Association State Competition. A team of four students earned a third-place finish in the Webmaster event.
- Four Scarlet Knights, including one middle school student, were selected for region band.
- Several athletic teams won region championships, including boys' tennis, softball, boys' soccer, and baseball.
- Six students received athletic scholarships.
- Several students were selected to participate in all-star athletic events, including one cheerleader and four football players in the Border Bowl; one football player in the North-South Football Game; and one softball player in the North-South Softball Game.

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the on-time graduation rate for students will be 82% or will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the percentage of students who score 70 or above on the End-of-Course Examination Program assessments will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the mean composite SAT score will meet or exceed the national average.

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the mean composite ACT score will meet or exceed the state average.

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the percentage of students who score 3 or above on AP Exams will meet or exceed the average of schools with students comparable to ours.

Teacher/Administrator Quality

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the number of core academic subject area teachers who maintain highly qualified status will be 99%.

School Climate

By the end of the 2017-2018 academic year, the percentage of students, parents, and teachers satisfied with the learning environment, physical environment, and home-school relations will be at least 82%.
