Barnwell School District 45 is proud of the accomplishments of our district. This was made possible by our outstanding faculty and staff. All employees in our district strive to provide rigorous and challenging opportunities for our students. Barnwell is governed by a five-member Board of Trustees elected for three-year terms.

We have updated our five year strategic plan and begun a multi-year project to upgrade facilities. Our facilities are clean, well maintained and equipped to support any modern education programs.

We offer teacher salaries that are among the highest in the state.

Students in each school benefit from services contributed by community volunteers, businesses, and industries. Each school is adopted by local businesses and industries.

For 20 consecutive years, Barnwell Schools has met all Standards of Quality which evaluate a district's performance in achievement test results, accreditation deficiencies, drop-out rates, student and staff attendance. These standards are set each year by the South Carolina State Board of Education.

Parents and community members have opportunities for active involvement in Barnwell Schools through School Improvement Councils, Scarlet Knights Band Boosters Club, and the Warhorse Booster Club.

Citizens in Barnwell School District 45 who are retired or who are 65 or older may receive a *GOLDEN PASS*. The pass allows free admission to home athletic events and other activities.

Art, music, and physical education are taught in all schools of the district.

Psychological and health services are supplied by professional personnel. Students are screened for speech and hearing.

There are over 1,000 computers in the district that are used to assist with instruction and administration.

School Lunch Program: 4 cafeterias serve an average of 1900 lunches and 750 breakfasts daily.

It is our belief that we will continue to improve as long as we work together with our students as our focus. We wish to provide the very best possible educational experience for your children. Major Accomplishments for 2010-2011 School Year

- Our senior class of 2011 earned in excess of \$2,990,987.00 in scholarships.
- In 2011, twenty-nine seniors earned Enhanced Diplomas.
- Eight Barnwell High School seniors earned the President's Education Award based on PSAT scores.
- BHS Trivia Bowl team placed 2nd in the USC Salkehatchie High School Bowl.
- Barnwell High School continued to partner with the Southern Regional Education Board and the State Department of Education in the <u>High Schools That Work</u> initiative.
- Approximately 30 Barnwell High School students and community members volunteered their time during the 2010-11 school year to mentor students at Barnwell Primary, Barnwell Elementary, and Guinyard-Butler Middle School. The mentors offer love, encouragement, and advice to help students feel better about themselves and have a greater chance to experience success in their lives.
- The Barnwell High School JROTC was designated as Junior ROTC "Honor Unit with Distinction" during the 2010-2011 school year. The Department of the Army presents this award only to the Junior ROTC units that maintain an exceptionally high standard of performance.
- The Army JROTC Academic Team competed in the National Academic Bowl on the campus of George Mason University in Washington, D.C. The competition involved two rounds of competitive on-line play against thousands of JROTC students from across the world in order to win a slot in the championship. Our team was one of only 24 in the nation to advance to the finals in DC, and this selection placed us in the top 2% of all JROTC programs.
- Four Barnwell High School seniors were named South Carolina Palmetto Fellows and each received scholarships for approximately \$26,800 (\$6,700 annually) to attend a college in South Carolina. Eligibility requirements include at least 1200 on SAT or 27 on ACT, a 3.5 GPA, and rank in the top six percent of their class.
- Twenty-one students were recipients of the South Carolina four year Life Scholarship for approximately \$105,000 (\$5,000 annually) to attend a four year college or university in South Carolina.
- Twelve students were recipients of the South Carolina two- year Life Scholarship for approximately \$40,560 (\$3,380 annually) to attend a two year college in South Carolina.
- Fifty-four students were recipients of the South Carolina Lottery Tuition for approximately \$50,544 (\$936 annually).
- Seven students were recipients of the South Carolina HOPE Scholarship for approximately \$18,550 (\$2,650 annually).
- One Barnwell High School student is enrolled in the residential South Carolina Governor's School of Science and Math.

- Fifteen seniors were recognized by the SC High School League as scholar athletes.
- Two Barnwell High School students attended the Hugh O'Brian Leadership Seminar.
- Through the National Merit Scholarship Program, Barnwell High produced one 2009 National Merit Commended Student from the 2011 graduating senior class. The student placed among the top five percent of more than 1.5 million students who took the 2009 Preliminary SAT (PSAT).
- The 2011 graduating class of Barnwell High School had four honor graduates.
- Two Barnwell High School juniors were named Furman Scholars.
- Two graduating seniors received the South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Award.
- Nine students attended Boys and Girls State.
- Two students won the Wendy's High School Heisman Award.
- The "Scarlet Knights" Marching Band earned an excellent rating for Marching Band at Bands Across the Savannah.
- The Varsity Girls Softball Team are Region Champions, District 5 Champions, and Lower State Champions.
- Barnwell High School had one student to sign to play ball on the collegiate level in softball.
- Barnwell High School had an 18.6 composite score on the ACT.
- Barnwell High School Cheerleading Squad received the "Most Spirited Squad" award.
- Five cheerleaders were named All -American.
- The Debate team won total of twenty trophies during competitions for the 2010-11 school year.
- Twenty students were inducted into the National Honor Society.
- One student was named a State 4-H winner and attended the National 4-H Congress in Atlanta. The selection for this honor was based on past project work, leadership, and service. The student also received a \$500 college scholarship.
- Four boys soccer players were selected to All Region team and one player selected to the North South team.
- The girls cross country team qualified for the state meet.
- One track team member qualified for state and placed second place in the state for discus and fourth in the shot.
- One track team member qualified for state and placed seventh in the state for discus and was also named all region champions in the discus.
- One member of the girl's tennis team was named "All Region".
- Two members of the boy's tennis team were named "All Region".
- A student was honored by WJBF Channel 6 in Augusta as Scholar Athlete of the Week.

BPS Major Accomplishment

- We are in partnership with the Save the Children Foundation to provide Reading Intervention for 60 students. We also have a Early Steps to School Success Early Childhood Coordinator who serves 20 children ages 0-2 and 30 students through the Raising the Reader Program.
