2018 - 2019 Goals

Goal 1: By June 2019, there will be a 45% decrease in referrals for minor infractions between August 2018—June 2019. **Goal 2:** By June 2019, 95% of parents will attend school related events and 100% will attend student transition conferences. **Goal 3:** By June 2019, we will decrease the number of students reporting to GOA multiple times during the school year by 70% between August 2018 and June 2019.

Progress and Actions Planned

The aforementioned goals were created based on our Alternative School Plan goals and student needs. In an effort to continuously improve, the administration provided surveys to teachers to identify needs. We are proud to report that referrals for minor infractions have drastically decreased and all parents have attended transition meetings. We are working to improve parent attendance at activities through School Messenger notifications, calling parents to remind them of events, and by sending flyers and emails.

Students made significant growth on the spring 2019 MAP assessment and several exceeded their goal by more than 20 points. We are extremely proud of their efforts and we believe goal setting and teacher motivation resulted in these gains.
