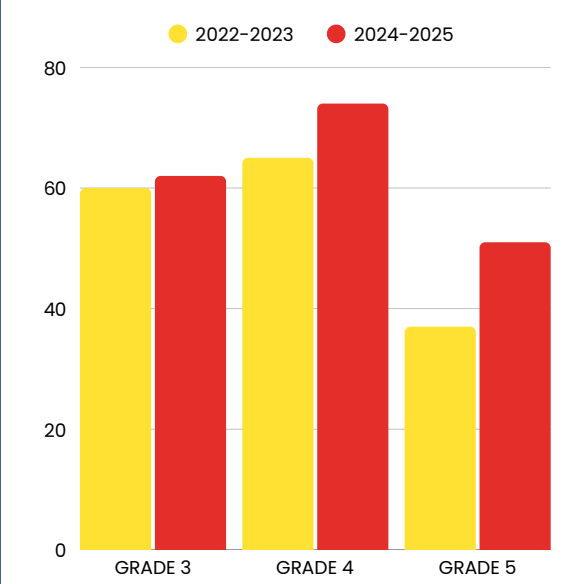


PERCENT MET OR EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS
