Student Performance

Students at Carolina Springs Elementary School have made tremendous progress in their performance in Reading and Math as measured by the MAP testing program. Final MAP testing is underway for the 2010-2011 school year,

but results from last year's administration are listed below in terms of the percent of students who met their growth targets:

Progress on Goals for 2010-2011

- Response to Intervention Program was fully operational in meeting needs of our struggling learners in reading and in math. A large number of students have been served and progress is impressive. We feel this helped us achieve the Palmetto Silver Award.
- "Situation Room" model afforded us the opportunity to monitor student progress effectively and make instructional decisions to achieve higher levels of success for these students.
- Math scores showed tremendous improvement as we fully implemented the new math series and enjoyed our first Family Math Night with the support of Food Lion on South Lake Drive.
- Grants were written and received bringing in more than \$5,000.00 in additional funds to support our instructional program.
- Strong partnerships to support our Around the World Island Style theme were established particularly with community members and with the University of South Carolina Darla Moore School of Business (thanks to parent Tina Poindexter).
- Results of the "school safety survey" show that a higher percentage of students are feeling safe on our campus.
- Students were recognized regularly for character and good citizenship through the "blaze bucks" program, PAWS ("Pawsitively Awesome Well –behaved Students") Café, Passport Party, Bus Challenge Winners and other special recognitions.
- Through strong support from the CSES PTO our school climate has been enhanced. Over 450 plants and shrubs were added to our campus through the hard work of parent volunteers and strong leadership by committee chair Crystal Trimnal. Michelin Corporation provided a SC
