In April, we proudly earned the distinction of a National Showcase Capturing Kids' Hearts (CKH) School! This honor underscores our shared focus and commitment to quality relationships as a foundation to our educational program. We intentionally cultivate healthy relationships and positive classroom environments to maximize each student's educational progress. Through CKH, we learn, practice, and develop power skills including interpersonal skills, self-advocacy skills, and good citizenship.

We continue to strengthen and refine our work with the student engagement instructional model by creating learning experiences that leverage technology, academic collaboration,, and support of individual student needs through teacher-led small groups. We are proud to be in our second year as a member of the Dynamic Learning Project, a national program supported by Digital Promise, EdTechTeam, and Google, aimed at improving education equity by empowering teachers to leverage technology in more powerful ways.

CSMS intends to apply for the 21st Century Community Learning Centers grant to procure funds that will provide enrichment to students through an after school program. This program will provide extracurricular opportunities, additional academic support and targeted instruction to qualifying students who may otherwise not have access to such opportunities. Students will have the opportunity to learn financial literacy, leadership, goal setting, and other important life skills.

Parents and guardians visited and volunteered in activities and events including All Pro Dads, "One Book, One School" Night, World Cultures Night, and various field trips.
