We are in our third year of full implementation of a blended learning instructional model in all core content areas. As such, our students benefit from increased, consistent personalized learning experiences, opportunities to work collaboratively, and a multitude of digital learning platforms that both support and extend learning outcomes. This year, we were one of one of 50 schools in the United States that participated in the pilot year of the Dynamic Learning Project, a national program supported by Digital Promise, EdTechTeam, and Google, aimed at improving education equity by empowering teachers to leverage technology in more powerful ways.
