PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

This Report is issued by the Lady's Island Middle School Improvement Council - - an advisory Board to the principal dedicated to improving student achievement. The SIC hopes to share information on the school's progress in meeting goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments during the year.

BEST PRACTICES IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

- ABC Project - LIMS is an Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) School
- AdvancED STEM Certified—LIMS is the first middle school accredited STEAM School
- Edgenuity and MyPath - Differentiated learning in the classroom and at home via a virtual learning environment
- Technology Integration – Interactive technology and one-to-one Dell devices in school and at home encourages engagement of students during the instructional process
- Response to Intervention (RtI) - School-wide daily academic support for students performing below grade level in Math and ELA
- Fountas & Pinnell - Formative assessment for reading comprehension and fluency for 6th grade students
- Accelerated and Advanced Studies - Classes designed to challenge qualifying 6th—8th grade students to include Advanced Math, Accelerated Math, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Geometry, English I, Advanced English/Language Arts, Advanced Social Studies, Advanced Science and Earth Science. Classes are taught by certified Gifted and Talented teachers who work in interdisciplinary teams to improve student learning
- Writing Workshop - Framework of characteristics of good writing: ideas, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, conventions, and presentation
- Reading Workshop—Framework of characteristics of good reading: explicit teaching of reading strategies and skills followed by meaningful tasks
- Academic Arts Classes - Instruction in Art, Band, Chorus, Career and College Readiness, Physical Education, Health, Gateway to Technology, Spanish, Dance, Edgenuity,
- Instructional Coaches - Onsite professional developers who teach educators how to use proven teaching methods in Literacy, Math, and Technology
- Differentiated Instruction - Instruction geared toward the academic ability level of students based on data from MAP and benchmark testing results
- 2 Full-time School Counselors, a Media Specialist, and a part -time Speech/Language Pathologist and ESOL teacher
- Professional Learning Communities (PLC) - Ongoing and weekly professional development for teachers to provide effective best practices for students
