EAGLE HIGHLIGHTS!

Beaufort High School continues to be an excellent school that strives daily to improve. Our students maintain our competitive tradition and represent our school well in many areas, including academic, athletic, and artistic competitions. Our community (including Business Partners, SIC, Booster Club, and PEP Club) is actively involved in making our school the best it can be. Our teachers and administrators work diligently every day to make BHS a great place to receive an education.

Here are some of this year's highlights:

- Thirteen BHS seniors are Senior Scholars
- Three Students qualified as finalists to be recognized as a National Merit Scholar
- Four Students awarded the Heritage Foundation Scholarship
- Palmetto Gold Award Winner
- Created a Parent Teacher Student Organization (PTSO) to support Beaufort High Students.
- The Drama Department's anti-bullying play, *If You See Something, Say Something*. Performances have been showcased statewide during the regional Rotary Conventions. The anti-bullying play has created numerous opportunities for our drama students and seen by thousands of students and adults in our region.
- The Dance Department hosted this year's 20th Annual Beaufort County Dance Festival sponsoring classes and workshops for 300 students each day. The final day of the festival involved approximately 600 dancers from across the county showcasing their work.
- The BHS Voices earned 1st place and most outstanding choral performance at the World Strides Heritage Presidential Inaugural Festival in Washington, DC.
- Five students were accepted in All State Chorus. At their most recent concert, Voices collected canned goods to donate to Help of Beaufort.
- The BHS Band kick started the year with an emphasis on Marching Band and Competitions. They have been seen at football games, in parades and in competitions. Thirty-two BHS band students were identified to play on the All County Band and three students participated in the USC Honor Band Clinic.
- Three art students have art work published in the book *River of Words: Musings on Port Royal Sound Anthology 2013.* One art student received a "Best In Show" at the Annual Beaufort Art Association Show.
- Two of our art teachers have received a grant from the Northern Beaufort Education Foundation entitled, *The Business of Art*. The funds will be used to kick start the first annual BHS juried art show.
- The art department hosted two separate art shows and openings for the 2012 2013 school year.
- The Freshman Academy received the Beaufort County School District Foundation for Educational Excellence Priority Projects Fund Grant totaling \$498.95 to purchase workbooks for the End of Course Exams.
- A Beaufort High Student set the world record in Speed Stacking.
- Five BHS students have been accepted to the South Carolina Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities.

Programs and Strategies:

This year, we have implemented a variety of programs and strategies designed to have a positive im-

- Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI)
- Ruby Payne Program: A program that is designed to train staff on understanding how poverty affects students in school and overall student achievement.
- Anti-Bullying Program: Freshman Academy students attended the *If You See Something, Say Something,* a play on bullying presented by the Performing Arts Department.
- College Exploration Day: A program designed for 9th and 10th grade students to engage student interests in attending college.

Class AAAA Sports Highlights:

Varsity Football: One player signed to play for Division I Charleston Southern University. **Varsity Girls Tennis:** They were region champs and played in Lower State Championship. Coach Riedmeyer was selected as Coach of the Year. One player was selected as All-State.

Varsity Wrestling: We were 22-7 finished 2nd in region 8, finished 2nd at Individual State Tournament and finished in the top eight in State Duals. One grappler won class 4A State Championship, four grapplers were selected as North/South All-Stars.

Varsity Baseball: Finished 2nd in Region 8. One player signed to play for Division II Erskine College.

Additional Initiatives and Strategies to Increase Student Success:

- We continue to provide SAT/ACT workshops, Teacher Cadet Program, AP classes and dual credit classes at Technical College of the Low Country to prepare and offer opportunity for college credits.
- We provide a credit recovery program (APEX) for students that are academically behind.
- Subject areas are continuing to develop common core and assessments to ensure the best practices are being used across the curriculum and that all students have the same opportunities.
- HSAP labs and EOC preparation classes continue to be implemented for students to prepare for testing.
- Instituted HSAP Academy for all 10th grade students prior to HSAP Testing.
