Beaufort High School continues to be an excellent school that strives daily to improve. Our students maintain our competitive tradition and represent our school well in many areas, including academic, athletic and artistic competitions. Additional Initiatives and Strategies for Student Success:

- We continue to provide SAT/ACT workshops, AP Boot Camp, Teacher Cadet Program, AP classes and dual credit classes at Technical College of the Lowcountry to prepare and offer opportunities for college credits.
- We provide a credit recovery program (APEX) and extended learning days to assist students who are academically behind.
- Subject areas are continuing to develop common pacing guides and assessments to ensure that best practices are being used across the curriculum and that all students have the same opportunities.
- Implement new 9th-grade success enhancement program focusing on math articulation with BHS teachers.
