Quick Academic Stats 2013-2014:

- High School Assessment Program (HSAP) Exam pass rate in 2012-2013 for second year students in both subjects: 85.4% up from 80.2% in 2011-2012.
- The pass rate for 2012-2013 in ELA was 92.4% and the math pass rate was 87.3%.
- EOC 74.6% in 2013, up from 64.1% in 2012.
- Advanced Placement Exams—a total of 498 exams in 12 subjects were taken by 409 students.
- BHS had 41 students who were awarded the distinction of AP Scholar. For the second year in a row and the second time in BHS AP history, we had one student named as a National AP Scholar.

Beaufort High School continues to be an excellent school that strives daily to improve. Our students maintain a competitive tradition and represent our school well in many areas, including academic, athletic, and artistic competitions. Class AAAA Sports Highlights:

Girls Tennis: Finished 3rd in Region VIII-AAAA, advanced to the second round of the playoffs.

Varsity Boys Basketball: Advanced to the first round of the playoffs.

Varsity Wrestling: We were 15-11 and finished 4th in Region VIII. We had four wrestlers advance the Individual State Tournament. Two seniors made North/South all-star team and were undefeated at that meet.

Varsity Baseball: Advanced to the playoffs and one player has signed a baseball scholarship to attend Winthrop University.

Varsity Softball: One player has signed a softball scholarship to attend North Greenville University.

Golf: One player signed to play at Clemson University.

Additional Initiatives and Strategies to Increase Student Success:
