hesitation, I would like to state that our teachers as well as other staff members are very talented, our School Improvement Council (SIC) and PTSO are actively engaged in promoting school improvements (curricular as well as extra-curricular), our parents are very willing partners in the education of their children, community members stand ready to assist us, and the vast majority of our students are striving toward excellence. Their efforts and the efforts of all BCHS staff members during the 2012-2013 school year were invaluable factors in realizing significant improvements in student achievement. These efforts have continued throughout the 2013-2014 school year. Our Absolute Rating was determined to be Good, and our Growth Rating was determined to be Average. The Absolute Rating, as determined by the SC Office of Assessment, when compared to last year, was an improvement. In fact, we realized a .2 index gain.

school's image, as we continue to believe, can be enhanced by offering opportunities **L**implementing initiatives that meet the needs of all students with embedded opportunities for stretching the students. The continuation of the TAP program led to significant gains in student achievement. In addition, we have increased STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) offerings. Embry-Riddle University and The Technical College of The Lowcountry (TCL) continue to support us in stretching students via STEM opportunities. These offerings provide students with diverse and rigorous opportunities that are tied to real world experiences. We would like to reflect on 2012-2013 and current BCHS highlights that will continue to serve as building blocks for our continuous improvement. Among the highlights are:

- Improved from 2012 to 2013 by **1.6%** in the overall passage rate for first-attempt students on the HSAP Exit Exam;
- Improved from 2012 to 2013 by 1.9% in Algebra 1,
 22.1 % in US History, and 3.6% overall on the SC End-of-Course (EOC) Exams;
- Improved from 2012 to 2013 by **5.8%** in on-time Graduation rate;
- Received a grade of "C" on the new Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA) Federal Accountability System;
- Received a TAP Value-Added score of "5" on a scale of 1-5 for the second year in a row;
- Received full program re-certification as a PLTW Pathway to Engineering Program;
- Two current seniors have earned the \$26,000.00 Palmetto Fellows Scholarship;
- Designated a Naval Honor School or Distinguished JROTC Unit for 21 years in a row;
- BCHS Teacher of the Year was one of our school district's five finalists for District Teacher of the Year;
- Four BCHS staff members were selected to present at our School District's 2014 "Best Practices Day;"
- One of our girls varsity track members was crowned **2013** state high jump champion; and
- Our wrestling team was crowned **2014 region**, **lower state**, and **state** champion.






