SIC Annual Goals

1. Continued SIC and PTA Relationship

- ⇒ Actions: SIC/Title I Committee and PTA met monthly to collaborate on school goals and enlisted help from PTA to achieve school improvement goals.
- ⇒ *Outcomes*: Developed list of activities for SIC and PTA to collaborate, including the addition of an installed book box for families to freely trade books, a reading bench to be installed, and a scrolling marquee sign project for the school is underway.

2. Improve School Climate through Virtual Times

- ⇒ Actions: Held monthly events for parent engagement such as: Title I workshops like Raising Readers, fall Trunk or Treat (drive-through), Read across America celebrations/Car Character Parade (drive-through), BINGO night and more. 100% of stake-holders were invited. Also, parents were welcomed weekly to story hour through the parenting center virtual sessions coordinated by Lori Hamilton, Parent and Family Engagement Center Liaison for EES.
- ⇒ *Outcomes*: Parent events were offered virtually this year due to Covid-19 pandemic restrictions. Based on sign-in sheet data at parenting events, virtual workshops attracted 1-5 participants, game nights up to 15 participants, and F2F drive -through events hosted 200+ participants.

3. Focused Technologies Support

- ⇒ *Actions*: Increased amount of technology in all classrooms, grades K-5 went 1:1. Additional technology purchases included: SeeSaw grades K-2 and Reflex Math grades 2-5.
- ⇒ *Outcomes*: based on data, student interventions continue to be effective, with improved reading and math data and increased technology use positively affects academic data.
