 - Fine Arts Math Intervention

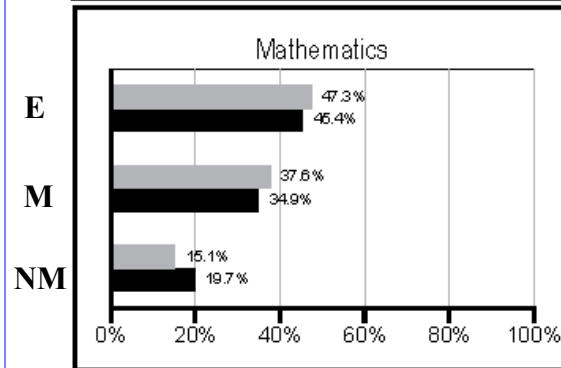
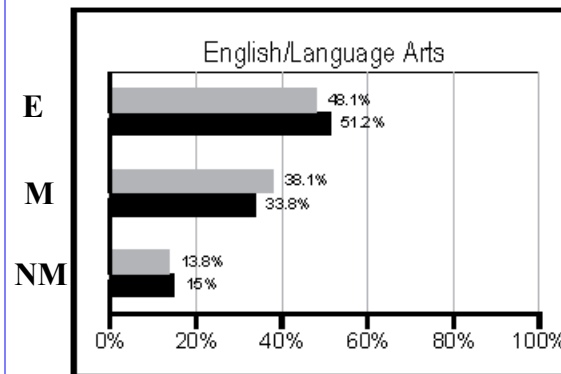
