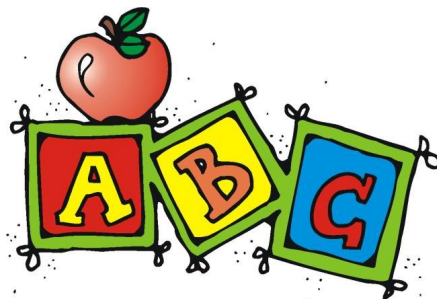

1. Strengthen SIC and PTA Relationship

- ⇒ *Actions: SIC and PTA met monthly to collaborate on school goals, enlisted help from PTA to achieve school improvement goals.*

2. Improve School Climate

- ⇒ *Actions: Held events such as STEAM/Title Day, Title I workshops, Cookies, Cocoa, and Coding Technology Night, Reading, Family Friendly Morning Duty, Trunk or Treat, and more. Parents always welcomed to School-Based parent center, along with monthly events calendar posted at the front of the school.*
- ⇒ *Outcomes: Significantly increased parent attendance at events based on sign-in sheet data at new parenting events such as Title I workshops and technology night. More involvement from parents in the Family Friendly morning duty opportunity. Furthermore a basketball court and Gaga ball pit were added equipment for students.*

3. Increase amount of student Interventions

- ⇒ *Actions: Increased amount of technology in all classrooms, grades 3-5 went 1:1 and Imagine Math was purchased, more supplies for small group literacy and math instruction, continued professional development for reading and math teachers/interventionists added Tier 2 intervention Reading Partners, added math intervention, and included PTA parent readers.*
- ⇒ *Outcomes: based on data, student interventions continue to be effective, with improved reading and math data, increased technology use positively affects academic data, Capturing Kids Hearts school-wide implementation, positively affects behavior.*
