  - 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th Grade Math Intervention

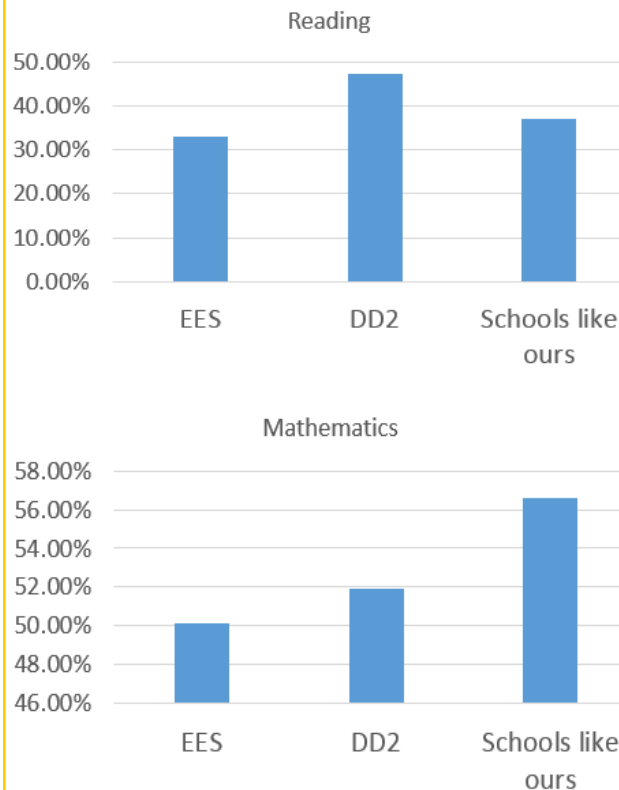
