Academics

We are diligently trying to obtain our academic goals by utilizing the following initiatives: Dual Credit Courses at Technical College of the Lowcountry (TCL) quarterly student recognition programs (Honor Roll, Distinguished List), Advanced Placement (AP) classes, four by four block schedule, Parent nights, credit recovery, ACT, ACT Work Keys, and EOC tutorial sessions during and after school, AVID elective, Upward Bound and Educational Talent Search through TCL, to name a few.

Our 2015 graduating class received over \$3 million in scholarships. Forty-six of our students qualified for the LIFE Scholarship and twelve for the Hope Scholarship. One student also received the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. We had 31 ACE Completer Programs Certificates and 12 RHHS CATE Completer Certificates.

Athletics

Our boys and girls varsity basketball teams are Region 5-AA champions again.

Just as in previous years we continue to offer junior varsity and varsity football, volleyball, junior varsity and varsity basketball, baseball, softball, cross country, girls and boys track, and girls and boys soccer. Both soccer teams made it to the play off rounds.
