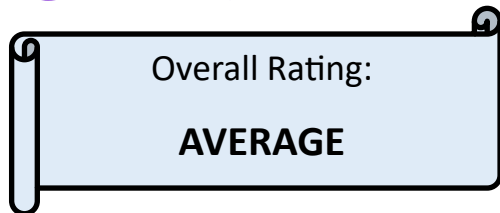


## Student Achievement:
