By 2024, Beaufort Elementary School will...

Goal #1: Increase number of students from 37% meets or exceeds expectation to 50% meets or exceeds expectations on the Math SC READY Assessment.

Goal #2: Increase number of students from 35.1% meets or exceeds expectations to 50.1% meets or exceeds expectations on the ELA SC READY Assessment.

Goal #3: Increase the number of kindergarten, first grade and second grade students scoring at the 50th percentile on NWEA MAP Math assessment from 49.1% to 59.1%

Goal #4: By 2024 winter administration of MAP Fluency, a minimum of 60% of first grade students will score level 4 or 5 for phonics/word recognition.

Goal #5: Increase the number of students scoring Meets or Exceeds from 42.2% to 52.2% on SC PASS Science assessment.

Goal #6: By 2024 Beaufort Elementary will increase the number of Read to Succeed endorsed teachers from 51% to 80%.

Goal #7: By 2024, Beaufort Elementary will increase the percentage of students with a positive score in the category of Self-Efficacy from 60% (Fall 2021) to 70% as measured by the Panorama Student Survey.
