## Student Achievement Goals

By 2022, the percent of students in kindergarten through 5th grade scoring above the 66th percentile will increase by 5 percentage points, from 2018-2019 values of 33.6% in Reading and 32.3% in Math, to 38.3% and 37.3% respectively.



## SIC Annual Goals
