Mean RIT Score — The mean RIT score for a grade level is the average of all the RIT scores of the students in that grade at IES. A RIT is a unit of measurement of a student's academic growth on a continuum of skills in reading and math (just as an inch is a unit of measurement of a child's physical growth on a yardstick).

Hilton Head Island Middle School participates in both norm-referenced (MAP) and criterion-referenced (PASS) testing. Parents have received our school's Report Card from the South Carolina State Department with our school's PASS results. Our parents have received individual results of their students' MAP and PASS scores.
