The School Improvement Council (SIC), is charged with preparing a Report to the Parents to keep parents apprised of the progress being made towards meeting stated goals and objectives as outlined in the School Improvement Plan. In addition, the Report to the Parents serves to make parents aware of the many programs, activities, awards and recognitions for students and teachers.

SIC Strategic Goals

Goal #1 Engagement

Our School Improvement Council is comprised of a diverse group of teachers, parents, administrators, and community members, who work together to address the needs of all of our students. We rely on a great mix of personalities, talents and experiences to make a strong SIC team. Our aim is to engage all stakeholders in the common goal of helping all of our children succeed.

Whether you wish to serve as a Board Member or attend the SIC meetings to stay updated with the latest information, meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month, from 6:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m., in the Media Center. These meetings are open to the public and all are encouraged to attend.

Goal #2 Student Achievement

The HHIMS AdvancED Accreditation School Improvement Plan is a document that outlines specific goals and interventions to help both the school and students improve. It is submitted to our District every five years and reviewed annually to ensure that progress is being made. The role of the SIC is to review and evaluate the AdvancED Accreditation Plan and to ensure that the planned actions are in alignment with the outlined goals.

Throughout the year, we help the school develop strategies to strengthen the program and to recommend changes where necessary. The primary goal is to help students and schools achieve success.

Many factors play a role in this success including increased instructional time, properly matched schedules, classroom assignments and increased academic offerings for our students. Our school administrators recognize these factors and have made changes to support them in our schedule, including a strict adherence to our 7:20 a.m. start time.

This change alone has enabled students to benefit from an average of 2.5 hours of additional classroom time each week, resulting in nearly 15 additional hours of instructional time since January!

Goal #3 Communication

In an effort to provide the most accurate, up to date and pertinent information to parents and community members, Hilton Head Island Middle School uses many different strategies to meet the needs of our school population. Weekly e-mail updates from our Principal, PTA announcements, phone blasts, updates on the school and SIC website, and the re-introduction of our Stingray Splash newsletter are some of the ways we are working to keep you informed.

In addition, your SIC members act as a liaison between parents, our school and our district, to answer questions and communicate issues of concern. Each grade level elects two parent representatives and has two additional ad hoc members for this purpose. Speak with them regularly so that you have the information you need to help your child succeed.

The success of our children relies on the shared responsibility between parents, teachers and an administration who believe that all children can succeed. Together, we will continue to work to enhance the learning environment and opportunities for all HHIMS students. I hope you will join us to help build a stronger foundation for their future.
