- RCMS improved on the State Report Card from Good to Excellent in its Absolute rating and maintained a Growth rating of Excellent.
- RCMS received a Gold award from the SC Department of Education for its students' performance on PASS.
- 23 8th graders qualified as Junior Scholars.
