The mission of Rudolph G. Gordon School, in cooperation with home and community, is to prepare children to become lifelong learners and responsible, productive citizens by creating meaningful learning experiences in a safe, nurturing environment.

Rudolph G. Gordon Elementary School was named after Dr. Rudolph G. Gordon, former district superintendent of Greenville County Schools, to acknowledge his accomplishments and leadership in education and the community. He retired in 2000, after serving as the district's seventh superintendent since consolidation in 1951. The school's media center is named after his late wife, Corine Smith Gordon. She served as a librarian in Greenville County Schools for 32 years.

The current facility has been expanded to include grades 6, 7, and 8. The new addition opened to 6th grade students in August 2018. The curriculum emphasizes student collaboration through a STEAM focus. Sports teams are provided for 7th grade students. Teams will be added next year for the 8th grade.
