Our school received an Excellent Absolute Performance Rating and an Excellent Growth Rating on our State Report Card. The Lyman faculty and staff will continue to work hard every day to better serve your students in meeting their academic needs. Because of the hard work of our students and teachers, our school has been awarded Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Absolute Performance and for Closing the Achievement Gap.

We provide many opportunities for student leadership and growth in areas other than academics. Some examples of student opportunities
are: Pride Patrol, Flag Helpers, Chorus, Student Council, Terrific Kids, and several Service Learning Projects.
