## SMART GOALS 2011-2012

- Grades three, four, five, and sixth grade combined will increase their typical mean growth in reading on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) from $41.5 \%$ in Fall 2011 to 45.7 \% in Spring 2012 (which is $10 \%$ of the typical mean growth). Evidence will be measured by the Fall 2011 to Spring 2012 Student Growth Summary Report from NWEA.
- Grades three, four, five, and sixth combined will increase their typical target growth on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) in mathematics from $42.2 \%$ in Fall 2011 to $46.4 \%$ in Spring 2012 (which is $10 \%$ of the target growth). Evidence will be measured by the Fall 2011 to Spring 2012 Student Growth Summary Report from NWEA.
- Decrease the number of referrals for the 2010-2011 school year from 453 by $50 \%$ to 227 for the 2011-2012 school year.
- Increase the attendance rate from $94.8 \%$ from the 20102011 school year to $95 \%$ for the 2011-2012 school year.
- Increase the percentage of Parent Teacher conferences conducted from $83 \%$ for the 2010-2011 school year to $88 \%$ for the 2011-2012 school year.
