SIC Annual Goal #1

The School Improvement Council for Hemingway Elementary School will continue to work with parents and the district office personnel to improve scholar attendance to reduce truancy.

Status: We have been working closely with the parents and the district personnel to implement attendance plans and home visits. We have an average of **93%** daily attendance which is about 270 scholars being present daily.
