

Visual Arts brought back a record number of awards (143) from the Coastal Carolina Fair and managed to win 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} place in the S.C. Duck Stamp Contest. They were also named the "Best of Berkeley County" for the 2nd straight year.

Cane Bay Athletics started the year with Football lighting up the Scoreboard with a 2nd place Region Finish and advancing to the second round of the playoffs. Wrestling took over from there, winning Region 8-4A and sending 10 wrestlers to the State Finals. During this time Cobra Cheerleaders were adding trophies to the case as well with a win at Lexington and at the Lowcountry Patriot Cheer Classic. Boy's Cross Country brought home a Region 8-4A title and Volleyball made it to the playoffs. SCHOOL REPORT CARD

Our students continue to meet our high expectations with exceptional scores on End-of-Course Exams, AP Tests and the newly implemented Work Keys and ACT Statewide Testing. Our graduation rate continues to surpass the state's average as well as the district's. Because of our successes, we were awarded 2 Gold distinctions from South Carolina Department of Education in 2 categories: General Student Academic Performance and Closing the Achievement Gap.

The 2016 Graduation Rate was 87.6%.
