- Provided funding for school counseling to support programs and enrichment for all students
- In 2021, we raised \$53,985.24 from Boosterthon, with \$11,150 going to teachers for classroom purchases, improvements, and supplies. Additional \$5,600 funded investments in reading materials such as Studies Weekly and Scholastic News. An additional \$4,700 in funds were provided to new staff members and those new to a grade level (or new to NPE) for classroom materials. Funds budgeted for playground equipment and outdoor seating remain at over \$19,000. A capital reserve account of \$20,000 is in our current PTA budget where funding is placed for our future Library furniture upgrade.
