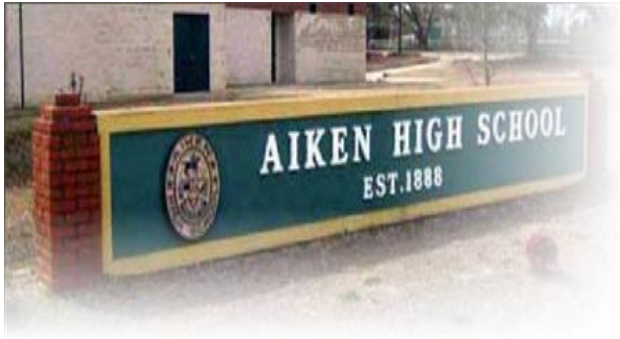

Accelerated Coursework

Aiken High School has a varied and challenging curriculum. College Prep and Honors courses are available in the core curriculum areas. Advanced Placement courses are offered in Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Language and Literature, European History, French, German, Music Theory, Physics, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Studio Art – 2D Design, Studio Art 3D – Design, Studio Art – Drawing, and United States History. Successful completion of Advanced Placement courses and the required exams allows students to receive college credit.

Students also have opportunities to earn additional high school credits through the SC Virtual School Program and APEX learning.

Teacher Cadet Program

Aiken High School offers a Teacher Cadet course that introduces students to the teaching profession. Students can receive college credit for successful completion of the course.
