## Performance Goals for 2011 - 2012

**Goal One:** There percentage of parents satisfied with the social and physical environment of our schools as measured by an end-of-year survey will increase from 93.8% in 2009-2010 to 95% in 2015-2016.

**Goal Two:** The percent of parents who participate in Title I funded instructional workshops will increase to 90% by 2015-2016.

**Goal Three:** The percentage of parents who report that the school exposed students for future careers and college during their K-5 experience will be 100%.

**Goal Four:** The percentage of all core academic subject area teachers who are highly qualified as defined by NCLB in the appropriate content and level will remain at 100% through 2016 and the percentage of paraprofessionals who are highly qualified will remain at 100% through 2016.

**Goal Five:** The percentage of teachers with advanced degrees will increase by 2% each year.

**Goal Six:** The percentage of students scoring “Not Met” in the subgroups identified by AYP will increase by 10% of the percentage from the previous year in ELA and Math PASS assessments.

**Goal Seven:** The percentage of kindergarten students reading on grade level will reach 75% by 2015.

**Goal Eight:** The percentage of students in grades 3-5 who score “Met” or “Exemplary” in ELA & Research and Math as measured by the state PASS assessments will increase to targeted benchmarks on each assessment by 2016.
