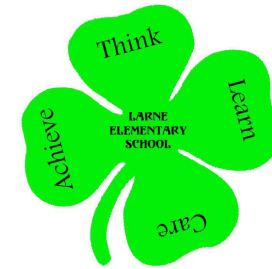

Mission Statement

Larne Elementary School: A community of learners, inspiring all to think, to learn, to achieve, and to care.

Performance Goals for 2011-2012

Goal One: The percentage of parents satisfied with the social and physical environment of our school as measured by an end-of-year survey will increase from 93.8% in 2009-2010 to 95% in 2015-2016.

Goal Two: The percent of parents who participate in Title I funded instructional workshops will increase to 90% by 2015-2016.

Goal Three: The percentage of parents who report that the school exposed students to future careers and college during their K-5 experience will be 100% by 2016.

Goal Four: The percentage of all core academic subject area teachers who are highly qualified as defined by NCLB in the appropriate content and level will remain at 100% through 2016, and the percentage of paraprofessionals who are highly qualified will remain at 100% through 2016.

Goal Five: The percentage of teachers with advanced degrees will increase by 2% each year.

Goal Six: The percentage of students scoring “Not Met” in the subgroups identified by AYP will decrease by 10% of the percentage from the previous year in ELA and Math PASS assessments.

Goal Seven: The percentage of kindergarten students reading on grade level will reach 75% by 2015.

Goal Eight: The percentage of students in grades 3-5 who score “Met” or “Exemplary” in ELA & Research and Math as measured by the state PASS assessments will increase to targeted benchmarks on each assessment by 2016.
