

Red Cedar Elementary School opened its doors in 2009 with 741 students. Today, our enrollment totals 779. With the opening of the new elementary school in Bluffton, our enrollment is expected to drop to a much more comfortable 559.

Your SIC has worked closely with the district and school board to make sure our needs are met with the upcoming student re-assignment plan. Next year, your SIC will focus on getting the information about the new attendance zones to all of our students and parents, as well as facilitate as smooth a transition as possible for all of the students being reassigned.

We created a 5 year School Renewal Plan (available here: <u>Plan</u>) based on the vision set forth by the school district and Superintendant Dr. Jeffrey Moss.

This year also will also see our first school-wide musical performance *Fun on 42nd Street* showcasing the talents of over 50 of our students and the extraordinary amount of dedication of our teachers and staff.

Finally, something we take tremendous pride in: We are Closing the Achievement Gap! We have shown (through year to year comparison of student growth as measured by state PASS scores) a significant increase in the performance of historically under-performing groups of students. How did we do that? Well, by doing Whatever It Takes, of course! Our WIT program continues with the entire staff of our school participating in 45 minutes each day of concentrated student instruction based on the needs of each student.

Next year promises even more exciting opportunities for our students as we transition into a Project-Based Learning School, and a School of Choice in 2015-2016.


