Student PASS data

Although BLMS students have not taken PASS as a collective body, subgroup comparisons based on performance at previous schools were used to determine students' test performance for African American, Hispanic, Disabled, Free/Reduced Lunch, and Limited English Proficient are shown in the next table. The table shows the percentage of students scoring at the met or above level on the 2010 PASS test.

For example, nationally 7th graders improve an average of 2.5 points in reading, whereas BLMS 7th graders have improved 5.7 points in reading.
