

LES performed above the state and district average in ELA and math on all three-grade levels. Our teachers challenge and encourage our students to do their very best. Our Response to Intervention Program (RTI) is focused on constantly helping every student develop early intervention strategies to be successful readers, writers, as well as a strong understanding of number sense. We have focused on independent reading, which cultivates the love of reading and promotes a literacy-rich environment for all learners.

Outside of the classroom, our clubs allow students to learn while being more involved in supporting their school. Some of our clubs include Student Council, Chess Club, Recycling Team, WLAB News Crew, Chorus, Young Student Leaders (YSL), and Run Hard club. Students also can enjoy extracurricular activities such as Tae-kwon-do, Cub Scouts, Ladies First, hands-on science, art, cheer, and dance.
