From the SIC



The SIC meets each month to present and discuss a variety of initiatives to enrich the lives of our students.

There were two focus areas during the school year continuing support for our garden club and gathering information and resources to begin the process of transforming into an arts

-integrated STEM school (AIS).

The school garden continues to blossom thanks to a grant from Lowe's and a USDA Fresh Fruit & Vegetable grant. Garden Club students have harvested radishes, rutabegas, and intended to harvest leafy greens, but nearby deer were too hungry. Faced with this problem, the students created scarecrows and investigated how to animal-proof their garden beds.

With grant funding, students across the school receive 3 fresh fruit or vegetable snacks each week, some of which is locally grown and delivered. Next year, the team plans to create additional sections of the garden club so that more students may participate as well as create raised landscaping beds outside of each classroom for individual class gardens.

Our school partnered with the S2TEM Center in Goose Creek, a part of the SC Lowcountry Math and Science Collaborative to begin implementing STEM into our arts-integrated curriculum. A leadership team was identified of administrators, teachers, arts teachers, students, and community members.

Our first steps were to explore the AdvancED certification process by collaborating with district staff and learning about what our sister schools in the BCSD have already done to achieve the certification. The team is ending the year working on gathering evidence of existing STEM practices to present to AdvancED so that a formal visit may take place. Additionally, the leadership team will spend several days over the summer creating integrated units of study that involve problembased learning.

The SIC was also instrumental in helping the school community develop a new combined mission-vision statement that better reflects what we are doing to reach our goal of student achievement and success.

The SIC also included representation from the fine arts staff at our school at each meeting. SIC members attended district arts strategic planning sessions several times during the school year.
