Home & School Connections

- SIC School Improvement Council serves as an advisory board to the principal and the school to improve instruction and facilities.

The Early College High School Initiative provides students the opportunity to receive a high school diploma and an Associate Degree or up to two years of college credit, by taking a mixture of high school and college classes. This differs from dual enrollment as dual enrollment students are enrolled in a traditional high school and take college classes whereas Early College take high school classes in preparation for full college workloads. At Early Colleges, students also take fewer high school classes because some of their college classes replace their high school classes.
