- Professional development support for understanding struggling readers and dyslexia

**Goal #3: Actively engage community and stakeholders at Mossy Oaks Elementary School.**

- Students are actively engaged in community service activities such as Project Care and Help of Beaufort.
- Many activities such as PTO sponsored events including Fall Festival and Annual Fun Run, StarBase, Marine Corps Band performance, Spring Cookout, Read Across America, Bikers Against Bullies, MOES Field Day, Kids Club, Family Focus Nights, Vanderbilt University Alternative Spring Break, etc., actively engage our community and

- stakeholders.
- SIC continues to find ways in which to involve all parents in the life of the school.
- SIC continues to identify business partners to support school events.

**2019-20 Priorities:**

- Develop student leadership team to serve as ambassadors of the school at Community Events and for school visitors
- Implement Parents in School Days for every grade level
- Implement Parent Volunteer Training Program

**Goal #4: Provide resources for appropriate learning environments.**

- SIC assisted with the writing of the school-based budget used to purchase materials to support the learning environment and to provide professional development opportunities for staff to support the learning environment.
- SIC assisted in the writing of the Title I Budget which allowed for additional funds for school support.

- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers based on comprehensive data analysis

- Emergency procedures reviewed with staff two times per year.

- Jacob’s Kit training for all faculty and staff

- Research and implement character education program
- Review and implementation of Covey’s 7 Habits for Students
- Increase number of Jacob’s Kits on campus
