### 21st Century Skills:

#### **Studio 1031**

Two groups of students rotate every other week to produce and host our daily news program, Mustang Watch.

### **AVID**

Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID), a national and college preparatory program, provides students with strategies designed around writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading. #### 7 Mindsets

Muller Road Middle School uses The 7 Mindsets for our Character Education Curriculum that is taught through weekly Advisory lessons. The 7 Mindsets curriculum focuses on lessons such as 'Everything is Possible', 'Passion First', 'Connections to Others', 'Live to Give', 'The Time to Act is Now', 'Have an Attitude of Gratitude', and 'Be 100% Accountable'.

#### **Power Lessons**


