### 1 TWO 1 Computing

### Schools-Within-A-School

#### AVID

## iBridge & C4 (Connecting in the 4th Dimension)

iBridge is a project based learning program for 6th grade with an instructional approach that presents students with real- world challenges. C4 is a project based learning program for 7th and 8th grade students that emphasizes learning through the four Cs: Creating, Critiquing, Communicating, and Connecting. 

# **Community Outreach**

#### **Richland Two Adult Education**

The W.R. Rogers Center opened a site at Muller Road Middle School for the 2014-2015 school year. GED classes as well as WorkKeys preparation and testing are offered for adult learners.

### **Student Charity**

Our students continue to make a positive impact in many areas of the community. From the giving of their time and talents in organizing, collecting, and distributing Pennies for Patients to planning, preparing, and managing a pollinator garden for butterflies and honey bees, and to donating items to the R2/Books-a-Million toy drive, our students demonstrate a compassion for those around them in need.

## Toys for Tots & Angel Tree

Our students provided a message of hope to less fortunate children by providing them with new toys, clothes, and food over the winter holidays.

### **Harvest Hope Food Bank**

Students collected canned goods and non-perishables food items during our winter holiday food drive competition.

## Back Pack Program

This program provides a weekend's worth of food in a backpack for homeless students.

### **Homeless Shelter Donations**

Students made tote bags and collected pillows, teddy bears, candy, and soap for a local homeless shelter.



## **SIC Annual Goals**

- Enhance parental involvement and communication: A SIC website was created with a listing of all members, goals, and minutes from each meeting. In an effort to increase participation during Parent Night, flyers were created and mailed out, along with emails and phone messages. Parent Night activities included refreshments and displays of student work and performances. We hosted two successful parent nights, increasing attendance and participation in comparison to previous years.
- Enhance Technology (Class updates, homework notices, grades, tests, note-taking, etc.): A teacher survey was conducted to review computer applications and other forms of communication currently being used. Informational flyers and videos were created to help students and parents better utilize technology resources. We worked to establish a schoolwide uniform work submission procedure.
- Enhance Social Services programs: A fundraiser is being held to provide support for the school's social worker to use as needed. The SIC and the social worker have worked in conjunction to enhance the school's food pantry and provide funding for meals, clothing, utilities, etc.
- Enhance the school environment: The SIC and the school beautification committee have worked together to enhance the aesthetic appearance of the school building. The SIC will enhance the appearance of the main hallways by installing new framed posters and/or artwork. The beautification club installed planters at the front of the school to hold a colorful array of various flowers.
