School Description

Powersville High School (PVHS) is located in the northern part of Anderson County, SC, near both the Greenville County and Pickens County borders and is one of three high schools in Anderson District One. Powersville is primarily a growing suburban community with workers traveling to the surrounding cities and is changing rapidly from its once rural roots. PVHS serves 1006 students in grades 9-12 and has grown tremendously since 2011, each year adding approximately 200 more students and, on average, 12 teachers. To date there are more than 100 members of the faculty and staff.

School Renewal Plans

Our performance goal areas:

-Powersville High School students will annually improve SAT composite score performance, increasing the school average points each year, or increasing a total composite average of 31 points by 2027.

-Powersville High school will increase the total percentage of students enrolling in one or more Advanced Placement courses each year by 2% or a total of 10% by 2027.

-Each Powersville High School graduation cohort will improve College or Career readiness by approximately 2% each year until 2027.

-Powersville High School will improve school-home relations, as indicated by parent surveys on the school report card, to a total of 10% over the next 5 years.

-At the end of the PLC cycle, 80% of PVHS teachers with 3+ years of experience in the PLC framework can be rated as "sustaining" on all indicators of the PLC at Work Continuum
